MASTER OF PUBLIC ADMINISTRATION (MPA)

The MPA program is a 36-credit program consisting of professional core courses, a research course, a capstone project, and student's choice of concentration area(s). Upon evaluation of the applicants transcripts or credentials, one or more foundation courses may be required.
